

College and Career Readiness Classes: Adult Basic Skills, Adult High School, High School Equivalency—GED® and HiSET®, and English Language Aquisition

All classes within the College and Career Readiness program are **free**. You must be at least 16 years old to enroll in one of our programs. If you are under 18 years old, we require a Rockingham Community College release form which can be picked up at RCC in the Bishopric Lifelong Learning Center or downloaded at www.rockinghamcc.edu.

New students and students who are returning after six months must attend a mandatory orientation session before enrolling in class. Orientation sessions are held on campus at RCC.

Classes are offered at many locations throughout Rockingham County including the RCC Campus, Eden Goodwill Community Resource Center, Reidsville Goodwill Community Resource Center, and NCWorks Career Center (located inside the Madison Post Office building). Online classes and other distance education programs are also available. Day and evening classes are offered.

Adult Basic Education (ABE)

The Adult Basic Education program is designed to help students who need to improve their reading, writing, speaking, problem solving, and math skills. These classes can help students prepare for working toward a high school equivalency diploma, advancing in developmental math and English courses, or even just functioning more effectively in society, on a job, or in the family.

High School Equivalency (HSE)

Two Tests—One Diploma: Rockingham Community College offers two assessment options for earning a high school equivalency diploma. Students can take either the **General Education Development (GED®) Test** or the **High School Equivalency Test (HiSET®)**. Students that pass either test are awarded the High School Equivalency Diploma by the North Carolina Board of Community Colleges. Free preparation classes are offered to give students an opportunity to gain the skills and knowledge needed to successfully pass either test.

Adult High School (AHS)

The Adult High School diploma program is for anyone who wants to complete his/her high school education and earn a high school diploma. Students must pass required high school level courses. Students are awarded credit for previously completed high school courses.

English Language Acquisition (ELA)

Formerly known as ESL, these free classes will help your speaking, reading, listening, and understanding of the English language. Students also learn about American customs and history. One-on-one tutoring is available.

Animal Care - CP is an animal care hybrid program designed for students who would like to assist the veterinarian in maximizing the health care of animals. The program is intended to train individuals to gain knowledge in the basic skills and dog grooming techniques necessary to perform in a veterinary office at an entry level position. Fee includes dog grooming and online veterinary assistant courses. Labs will require purchase of tools to groom your pet. Prepayment required.

Industrial Lift Truck Operator (Forklift)

Classroom and hands-on instruction in the operation of an industrial forklift truck. Forklift design, parts, operation, driving rules, safety and maintenance requirements are discussed as part of the classroom training portion. Students will operate an actual forklift during the second portion of the class. Students will learn forklift safety, general operating rules, OSHA regulations that apply to powered industrial trucks and the hazards present in the work environment. Proper driving techniques, proper balance for loads, center of gravity and load placement, safe fueling/recharging and completing an inspection checklist will also be covered. The student will receive a certificate of completion upon successful completion of the course.

Requirements for attestation, fees, general powers and limitations, certifications, oaths, affirmations and affidavits are taught. NC notaries must have a high school diploma or GED; must be at least 18 years old; read, write, and speak English; have no felony convictions; and complete the approved notary course. Additional costs include: commission fee to Secretary of State, \$50.00; swearing in at the courthouse, \$10; textbook required for class, \$27.92; notary seal, \$20-\$40 (approximate cost).
