Great news! Eligible 2020, 2021, and 2022 high school graduates can attend Rockingham Community College for free. For students applying for the fall semester, the North Carolina Longleaf Commitment Grant will provide up to \$1,400 per semester for four semesters. The funds can be used for RCC tuition, fees, and books.

This is a great opportunity to begin your educational journey. RCC has programs in nursing, business, computers, cosmetology, criminal justice, education, welding, machining, and industrial technologies. You may also choose to earn one of our two-year transfer degrees and complete your program at a 4-year college or university. There has never been a better time to attend Rockingham Community College.

Eligibility requirements for the North Carolina Longleaf Commitment Grant:

- Graduate from a North Carolina high school or homeschool in 2020, 2021, or 2022. Students who complete GED, HiSET, or Adult High School are also eligible.
- Be a North Carolina resident.
- Be a first-time college student. Students who took courses while in high school (Career & College Promise or Early College), and have not taken a college course since graduating from high school are also eligible.
- Enroll in a curriculum program during the 2022-2023 academic year.
- Enroll in at least six (6) credit hours per semester.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To receive an EFC and determine financial aid eligibility, submit a FAFSA at studentaid.gov.
- Have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) from \$0 - \$15,000. EFC is based upon a student's FAFSA determination.


For students wishing to earn a short-term workforce certification, we offer the Eagle Train and Gain Scholarship. The Eagle Train and Gain Scholarship is sponsored by the Rockingham Community College Foundation. The scholarship covers \$180 of the registration fee for eligible 96-hour workforce development programs - see page 11 for the program listing. This scholarship is open to in-state and out-ofstate continuing education students.

COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAMS

Associate Degree

RCC's associate degrees are designed for students wishing to transfer to a four-year university, and represent completion of approximately half of a bachelors degree program. The degrees require about 60 semester hours and can typically be completed within two years by full-time students.



CAREER & TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

Associate in Applied Science (AAS Degree)

These degrees proved extensive entry-level employment training in professional fields. AAS degrees range from 64 to 76 semester hours and can typically be completed within two years by full-time students.

Diploma

Diploma programs provide entry-level employment training in fields that require less extensive training than an AAS degree. These programs range from 36 to 48 semester hours and can usually be completed by full-time students within two semesters and one summer session.

Certificate

A certificate provides entry-level employment skills and is often a way to get specific training in an area related to a diploma or AAS degree. These programs range from 12 to 18 semester hours and can usually be completed within one semester.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

RCC offers numerous continuing education, short-term workforce development programs that lead to employment. Check out the courses and programs in this book, and be sure to review the ones for which scholarships are available (page 11).

ADULT HIGH SCHOOL

This tuition-free program helps qualifying adults complete a high school diploma through individualized instruction. Students must pass required high school level courses and students are awarded credit for previously completed high school courses. Interested individuals should call 336-342-4261 ext. 2146 to schedule a transcript evaluation appointment.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION AND HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY

Many students in our program are preparing to take an exam such as HiSET® or GED®, to earn a high school equivalency credential. Other students may have already completed a high school credential, but are improving their reading and math skills to be more competitive in the workforce or more successful in college courses.

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



CHANGE IN TUITION AND FEES

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY
