From the President's Desk

This spring, RCC will continue to award a grant or scholarship to ALL curriculum students and most 96+ hour continuing education students. It has never been a better time to be a student at RCC! The College has many options to help students financially, including:

Rockingham CARES Scholarship (Curriculum)

The Rockingham CARES Scholarship will provide \$600 or \$1,200 for every curriculum student enrolled in the spring 2022 semester at RCC not receiving the Longleaf Commitment Grant. Students enrolled in 1-6 credit hours will receive \$600 and students enrolled in 7 or more credit hours will receive \$1,200. The funds will be placed on the student's college account and can be used for tuition, fees, and books. Students may receive the CARES Scholarship in addition to federal aid and other scholarships. The Rockingham Cares Scholarship is awarded to in-state and out-of-state students. Any students who received this scholarship for fall 2021 must meet satisfactory academic progress to be eligible for spring 2022. Career & College Promise (CCP) and Early College High School students are not eligible for this scholarship. See page 3.

Longleaf Commitment Grant (Curriculum)

The Longleaf Commitment is a grant program for 2021 North Carolina high school or GED graduates who will attend Rockingham Community College starting in the Spring 2022 semester. Eligible 2021 high school graduates will receive this grant (it's not a loan!) for tuition and fees toward a degree or to attain transfer credit. Full-time eligible students are guaranteed to receive at least \$1,400 per semester for four semesters (two years). Less than full-time students may receive a partial award. Please encourage all 2021 High School grads to attend RCC this spring. See back cover.

Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund (Continuing Education)

GEER funds are available for eligible RCC students enrolled in an eligible 96-hour workforce program. The scholarship awards \$750 that can be used to help cover the cost of tuition, fees, books and supplies, credentialing tests, transportation, childcare, and other costs of attendance. Eligible students must be a N.C. resident. See page 12.

Eagle Train and Gain Scholarship (Continuing Education)

The Eagle Train and Gain Scholarship is sponsored by the Rockingham Community College Foundation. The scholarship covers \$180 of the registration fee for eligible 96-hour workforce development programs. This scholarship is open to in-state and out-of-state continuing education students. 
WHAT CAN I STUDY AT RCC?



UNIVERSITY TRANSFER PROGRAMS

Associate Degrees

These transfer degrees are designed for students wishing to transfer to a four-year university, and represent completion of approximately half of a bachelors degree program. The degrees require about 60 semester hours and can typically be completed within two years by full-time students.



CAREER & TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

Associate in Applied Science (AAS Degree)

These degrees proved extensive entry-level employment training in professional fields. AAS degrees range from 64 to 76 semester hours and can typically be completed within two years by full-time students.

Diploma

Diploma programs provide entry-level employment training in fields that require less extensive training than an AAS degree. These programs range from 36 to 48 semester hours and can usually be completed by full-time students within two semesters and one summer session.

Certificate

A certificate provides entry-level employment skills and is often a way to get specific training in an area related to a diploma or AAS degree. These programs range from 12 to 18 semester hours and can usually be completed within one semester.



Funding for training in these high-demand areas is provided through RCC's

Eagle Train & Gain Scholarship and the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund.



This program provides English- and Spanish-speaking students with hands-on training in a simulated salon environment. Course work includes instructions in all phases of professional imaging, hair design, chemical processes, skin care, nail care, multi-cultural practices, business/computer principles, product knowledge, and other selected topics. The program consists of three sessions. Sessions I and II prepare students for the State Board of Cosmetic Arts exam for an apprentice license (1,200 hours) and completion of Session III prepares students for a license (1,500 hours). There is a required orientation for all students to learn about textbooks, kits, uniforms, and the program schedule.

Scholarships Available!

Este programa proporciona a los estudiantes de habla inglesa y española capacitación práctica en un entorno de salón simulado. El trabajo del curso incluye instrucciones en todas las fases de imágenes profesionales, diseño de cabello, procesos químicos, cuidado de la piel, cuidado de las uñas, prácticas multiculturales, principios comerciales / informáticos, conocimiento de productos y otros temas seleccionados. El programa consta de tres sesiones. Las Sesiones I y II preparan a los estudiantes para el examen de la Junta Estatal de Artes Cosméticas para obtener una licencia de aprendiz (1,200 horas) y la finalización de la Sesión III prepara a los estudiantes para una licencia (1,500 horas). Hay una orientación obligatoria para que todos los estudiantes aprendan sobre libros de texto, kits, uniformes y el horario del programa.

Cybersecurity Analyst: This course prepares students to evaluate the weaknesses of traditional and wireless networks for the purpose of incident response, reconstruction, and investigative techniques. It is for professionals looking to perform data analysis and interpret the results, use threat detection tools, and protect applications and systems within an organization. Skills covered include threat and vulnerability management, security architecture, and cyber-incident response. Students will prepare for the CompTIA Cybersecurity Analyst (CySA+) exam. An intermediate IT skill level is recommended. Class meets face-to-face one night a week and a portion of the coursework is delivered online. Prepayment of tuition and purchase of the course materials is required. Registration fees do not include certification exam fees.



CHANGE IN TUITION AND FEES

The NC General Assembly sets tuition rates for most Continuing Education classes. Tuition is subject to change at any time. Fees are established by RCC Board of Trustees, state legislative action and/or the North Carolina Community College System Board and are also subject to change.

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY

The College reserves the right to cancel a class due to lack of enrollment. In this case, pre-registered/ pre-paid students will be issued a full refund. A student who officially withdraws from the class on or after the first day of classes but prior to or on the official 10% point of the semester will receive a 75% refund.
